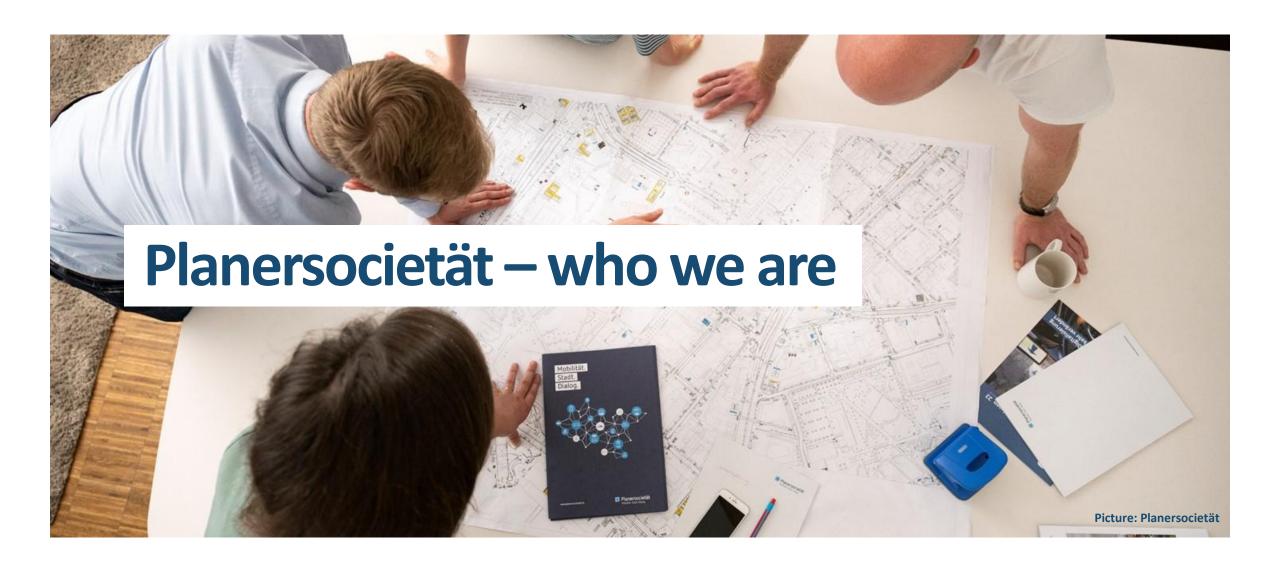

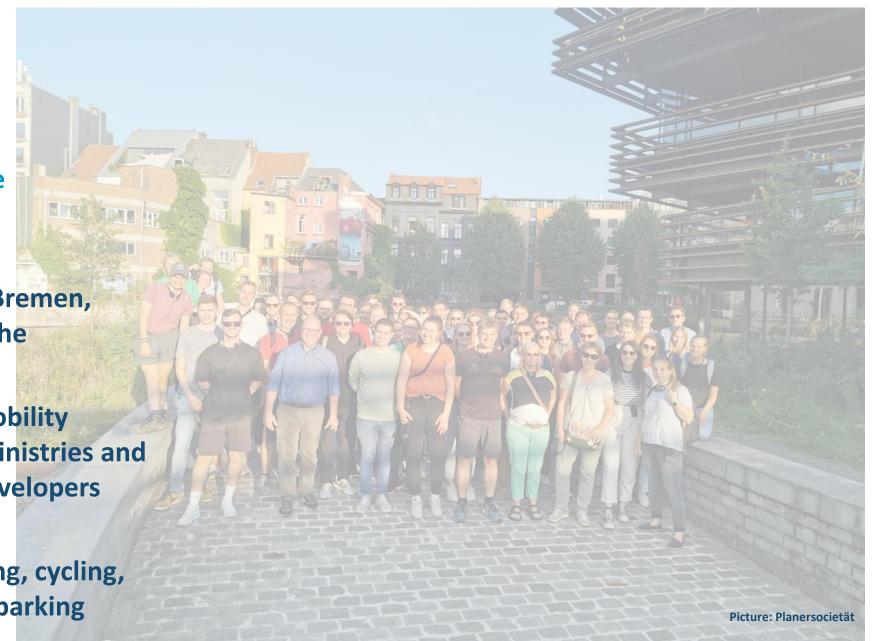

Planning process

Stage 1

2016 - 2018

- City Council resolution to draw up the Mobility Masterplan 2030
- Joint development of goals and fields of action
- Resolution of the City Council to accept Stage 1 in 2018

Stage 2

2019 - 2023

- Joint development of 6 strategies
- Resolution of the City Council to accept Stage 2in 2023

Stage 3

2023 onwards

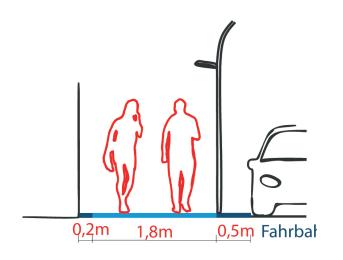


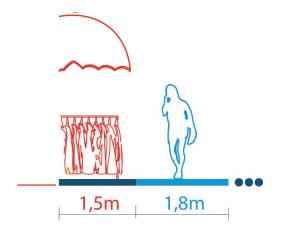
Status quo - modal split analysis

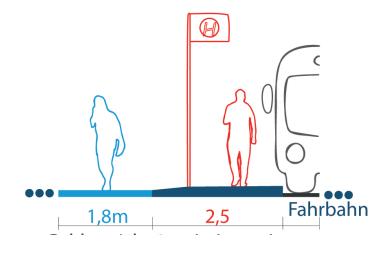


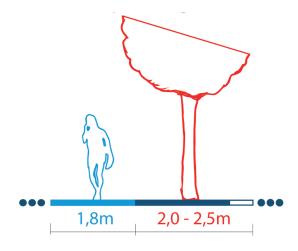


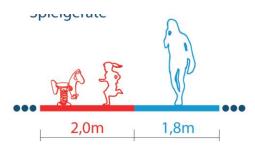

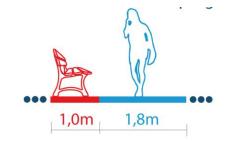


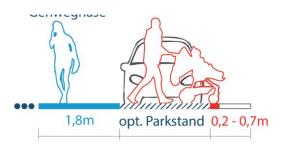






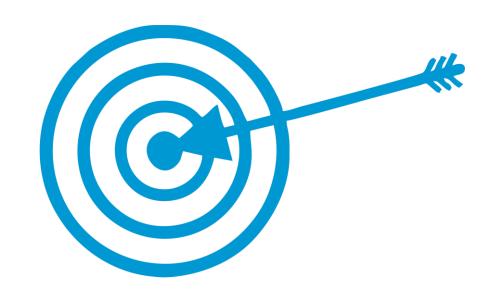






Planned (short-term) implementation packages

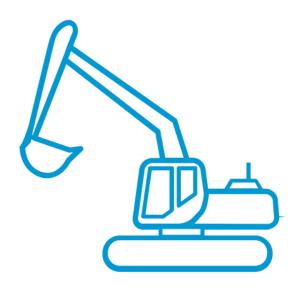
- Pedestrian traffic checks and local mobility concepts
- Illuminating pedestrian underpasses
- Pedestrian-friendly traffic lights
- More zebra crossings for Dortmund: 2 per year
- Development and implementation of two walking axes:
 city center → canal harbour & conversion area HSP
- More benches and resting-places for every city district
- Safe walking 365 days a year: winter service, cleaning, green maintenance
- My stop: Improving the surroundings of bus & train stops
- Digital participation: fault reporting (Dortmund-App)



Improvements carried out since 2022

- Reorganization of parking and elimination of sidewalk parking

 widening of sidewalks
 - Main roads: Ostwall (Radwall), Vinckeplatz, Asselner Hellweg
 - Side roads: Am Hombruchsfeld, Sonnenstraße (Radschnellweg)
- Barrier-free crossings
 - Leopoldstraße/Steinstraße
 - Kurfürstenstraße/Steinstraße
- Barrier-free renewal of sidewalks
 - Planetenfeldstraße
 - Successive barrier-free upgrading of footpaths in the entire city
- Separation of cycling and walking traffic





Lessons learned

Personal lessons learned

- There is a growing interest in walking/pedestrian transport
- Professionalisation of pedestrian transport planning is required; more staff was required & was subsequently hired
- Negative aspects are a major concern e. g. parking, barriers, traffic lights, crossings in general, safety etc.
- Not all user groups and political groups are able and willing to participate in the planning process
- Residents of the city centre districts are more involved
