


Walking Route Assessment

- Freely available a data collection tool: "KoBoToolbox" (https://www.kobotoolbox.org/)











Walking Hierarchy and SPWS

- The pavement is in good condition









Comparisons: Genoa vs Dortmund

What is the destination of the walk you want to evaluate?








Results: pavement condition

1. Pavement is in good condition

47% in Genoa and 40 % in Dortmund answered negatively because:

- the surface is uneven
- the surface is broken, with holes/cracks

Results: pavement space

2. Pavement has enough space

38 % in Genoa and 53 % in Dortmund answered negatively because:

- obstructed by parked cars
- too narrow for me and other people

"Illegal parking tolerated by the city"











Results: traffic safety

5. I feel safe from traffic when I walk

21 % in Genoa and 50 % in Dortmund answered negatively because:

- traffic at high speed
- no protection/separation from road traffic
- too much parking blocking my sight



"Way to school for hundreds of children"

"Spielstrasse" where kids should run and play"







Results: pleasant experience

8. My walking experience is pleasant

26 % in Genoa and 43 % in Dortmund answered positively because:

- there are enough/nice vegetation and green spaces
- the streets are designed for people
- there is no/little traffic noise
